

NJLA Executive Board ALA Councilor Report April 2023

ALA reports record number of demands to censor library books and materials in 2022.

The American Library Association's Office for Intellectual Freedom (OIF) has released new data documenting book challenges throughout the United States, finding that challenges were nearly double that of 2021, reaching the highest number of attempted book bans since ALA began compiling data about censorship in libraries more than 20 years ago.

2023 Theme "There's More to the Story" Highlights Multitude of Services Libraries Offer Communities During National Library Week, the ALA invites communities to observe the following:

- Monday, April 24: **Right to Read Day**, an inaugural celebration to acknowledge and promote the right to read and mark the one-year anniversary of ALA's Unite Against Book Bans campaign; the 2023 State of America's Libraries Report & Top Ten Frequently Challenged Books of 2022 will also be released on this day.
- Tuesday, April 25: **National Library Workers Day**, a day for library staff, users, administrators, and friends groups to recognize the valuable contributions made by all library workers.
- Wednesday, April 26: **National Library Outreach Day** (formerly National Bookmobile Day), celebrate library outreach and the dedicated library professionals who are meeting their patrons where they are.
- Thursday, April 27: <u>Take Action for Libraries Day</u>, a day to rally advocates to support libraries.

April is also **School Library Month**, sponsored by the American Association of School Librarians, an ALA division.

TIME has named Tracie D. Hall to the **2023 TIME100**, its annual list of the 100 most influential people in the world. The full list and related tributes appear in the April 24 issue of TIME, . Hall is the tenth executive director of the American Library Association and the first Black woman to helm the organization in its nearly 150-year history.
