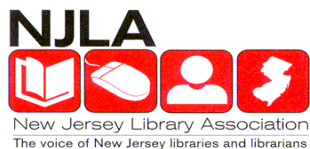

PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

PROGRAMS, EXHIBITORS (ARCHITECTS, SPACE PLANNING, BUILDING PROJECTS), NETWORKING

A1. 10:00 – 11:30am

Facilities Management 101 or I Didn't Learn How to Run a Building in Library School. Presenters: Carol Hart-Sosinski and Manuel Paredes.

TEAM OPPORTUNITY: LIBRARY ADMINISTRATOR IS ENCOURAGED TO ATTEND WITH PRIMARY MAINTENANCE STAFF MEMBER.

Carol Hart-Sosinski, President of the NJ Facilities Management Association, will focus on the philosophy of facilities management, including, planning and scheduling maintenance as opposed to responding to building emergencies.

Manuel Paredes, Director of the Cherry Hill Public Library will address special facilities management challenges for libraries.

Sustainability in Library Buildings. Presenter: Suzan Globus of Globus Design Associates.

Suzan Globus is a LEED Accredited Professional and a presenter at the PSEG's Green Fest and Princeton Library's Green Film Festival. She will focus on renovating and going green in existing library spaces including a case study on space planning.

Learn more about what going green really means, receive a checklist and low cost steps to sustainability, questions to ask vendors before you buy, how to conduct a building audit and to audit your operations, how to create a sustainable community among your staff, and how to manage the change of going green. Current resources on these areas will be presented including on funding, from blogs, books, programs, and more.

Renovating Historical Facilities.

Recent Renovations and Expansions in NJ Libraries.

Presenters: MaryEllen Firestone, Library Director at East Brunswick Public Library. Irene Goldberg, Library Director and hostess of the Building Fair at Monroe Township Public Library with Anthony Iovino, Arcari and Iovino.

Irene Goldberg, Director of the Monroe Township Library, and **Anthony Iovino** will cover the recent 24,000 square foot expansion and many new features, including a drive through for customers.

Library Director **MaryEllen Firestone** will talk about the recent renovation to the East Brunswick Library to add new children's and adult reading areas. This library had little room to expand so utilizing the existing space was paramount. See the latest in new spaces in Middlesex County libraries.

Choosing Public Art at Your Library.

Presenter: Tom Moran, Director of Arts Inclusion at the NJ State Council on the Arts.

He has worked with Princeton, Ocean County and Monroe Township Libraries, as well as Rutgers University in developing art for the public.

Making a Success Out of a Green Building Project.

Presenters: **Louise Berry**, Library Director and **Alan Gray**, Assistant Director of Operations from Darien Library in Darien, Connecticut.

What makes a green building project successful? Objective measures such as LEED certification are important, but they should not be an end in themselves.

Darien Public Library took many steps towards "green" rethinking of its services, its business processes, and its staffing when it embarked on a building program that is projected to achieve LEED Gold Certification. But it may be that the changes to services, business processes and staffing are more important in the long run, and can be considered by other libraries whether or not they are planning for construction or renovation.
